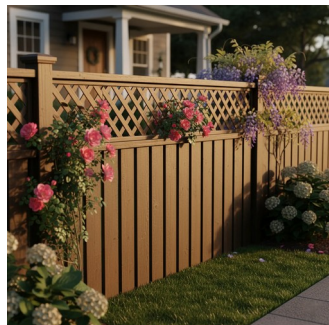

Best For: Privacy, Aesthetic Appeal, and a Natural Look



Pros: Classic & Private

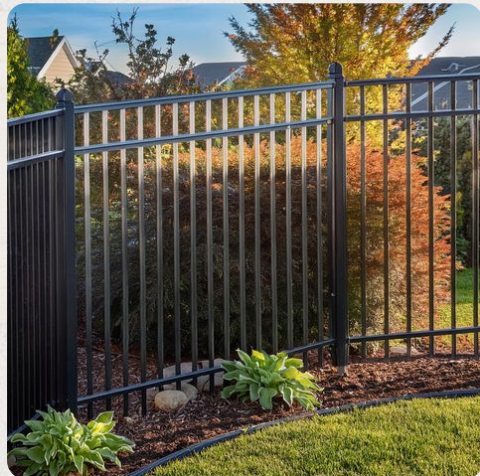

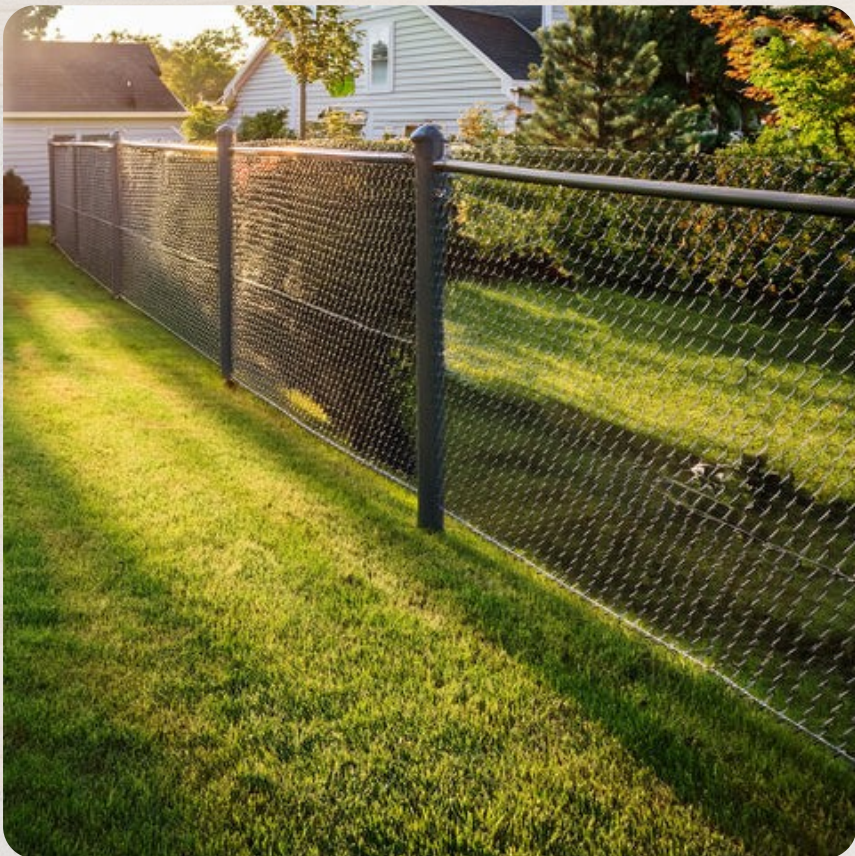

- **WPC:** Features a moderate upfront cost, but expect significantly higher long-term maintenance costs for staining and repairs.
- **PVC & Aluminum:** Come with higher upfront price tags, but their extended lifespans and minimal maintenance requirements save money over time.



Consider Total Cost of Ownership

Don't just focus on the initial installation price. Calculate the **cumulative maintenance costs** over the fence's expected 15-25 year lifespan.

Investing a little more upfront in low-maintenance materials like PVC or aluminum can save you significant time, money, and stress in the long run.

Pro Tip: View your fence as a long-term home investment, not just a one-time expense.

Step 6: Evaluate Installation Complexity

The difficulty of installation can drastically affect the total project cost, especially if you plan to DIY.



WPC • Moderate to Hard

Labor-intensive, requires precise measurements, cutting, and careful post alignment.

PVC • Easy to Moderate

Lighter panels with a convenient snap-together design, though setting posts still requires care.

Aluminum • Easy to Moderate

Lightweight, pre-assembled panels that are similar to PVC in ease of handling.

Chain Link • Easy

A straightforward process involving unrolling the mesh and attaching it to posts with minimal tools.

Installation Breakdown: WPC vs. PVC



WPC Fence (Moderate to Hard)

Tools: Post-hole digger, level, saw, hammer, nails/screws.

Process: Dig deep post holes, set posts in concrete, cut and attach individual boards/panels.

Labor: Highly labor-intensive, can take several days for a DIY project.

Skill: Requires good measuring and carpentry skills for a professional finish.



PVC Fence (Easy to Moderate)

Tools: Post-hole digger, level, screws/brackets.
